The phrase above is the title to my favorite religious song. I probably appreciate it more since I'm older and have felt the pains of age. You find yourself when your older falling more often, and struggling sometimes to keep your balance. Solomon writes, *“Also when they shall be afraid of that which is high, and fears shall be in the way, and the almond tree shall flourish, and the grasshopper shall be a burden, and desire shall fail: because man goeth to his long home, and the mourners go about the streets”* (Eccl. 12:5).

So if you speak allegorically or literally, it is sometimes a great burden to age. Yet if one ages holding the Master's hand, it can be rewarding and uplifting. For though we live in these frail bodies, we have a spirit that is refreshed every day by the soothing touch of Jesus.

If we hold to the thought that I cannot walk one step without Him, and truly live as such, imagine how much better our lives would be. Is that not the premise presented at the end of Psalm's twenty-three? David walking through the shadow of death and having no fear because *“thou art with me!”*

“The mountain's too high and the valley's too wide. I'm down on my knees that where I learned to stand. O Lord, I can't even walk without you holding my hand!”

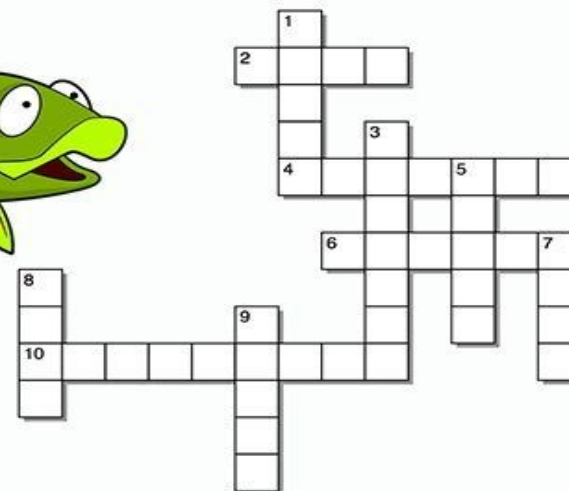
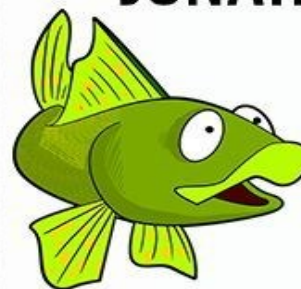
